Changes to our Bylaws – Bylaws # 2.2, Term of Office, was discussed in length. Up for consideration was a change that would lengthen the amount of consecutive term served. Pat Murray made a motion to change the language "... three consecutive terms ..." to read "... four consecutive terms ...". Maggie seconded the motion and discussion followed. After lengthy discussion, an amended motion was made by Jane to change the language from "... three consecutive terms..." to read "... for consecutive terms". Jan seconded the motion. Motion voted on and carried unanimously. For clarification our length of term runs from 7/1 of one year, through 6/30 of the next year.

Report from Cuyamaça Council – Maggie reported that she is targeting groups on campus that normally do not hear about the Chancellor's Classified Senate Award nomination and publicizing it more. She asked Jan to report on the last IPC meeting that she attended for her. Jan reported on the upcoming Budget Workshops to be presented by Dr. Suarez on both campuses. The IPC subcommittee also recently completed the compilation of a New Classified Orientation Outline which includes a nice binder (see **Attachment A**.) There was a reminder about the Spring Celebration in the Museum on April 3rd from 2-4 p.m. After lengthy discussion, the committee decided that the upcoming Iraq Teach In should be presented for faculty and staff only, not students at this time. The possibility of a future event for the students was discussed. In the meantime, the Student Services Department will compose a flier regarding international events and campus resources to be distributed to interested students (see **Attachment B**.)
