ELIGIBILITY

- Enrollment in an approved course.
- Grade A or B in course upon completion.
- Student has learned and met student learning outcomes.

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WHAT IS ARTICULATED CREDIT?

Earning college credit for a high school course that has undergone the articulation process* and deemed eligible for college credit.

IS THERE A COST?

This is free. No cost to apply, no tuition or textbook costs.

HOW DOES A STUDENT EARN ARTICULATED CREDIT?

- Student must complete both semesters/quarters of the course.
- Student must receive a “B” or better both semesters AND meet student outcomes.
- Student must apply to [Grossmont](#) or [Cuyamaca](#) College. Applying to the college does not obligate student to attend.
- Student must create a [CATEMA](#) account and complete appropriate paperwork; credit is not awarded automatically.
 - College needs permission to open transcript, and place credit.
 - Student and Parent/Guardian signature required if under the age of 18, to indicate knowledge of credit being awarded.

HOW LONG IS THIS CREDIT GOOD FOR?

Once the units are posted to a transcript, the units are there forever.

ARE ALL COURSES ARTICULATED?

No, not all courses are articulated. You can earn articulated credit for certain [courses](#) that have undergone the articulation process.

WHO'S A GOOD FIT?

Any student interested in earning college credit while in high school to advance their college and career pathways.

**The articulation process compares the content of the high school course with the content of a similar college course.*
