3. College Course Description

This course will explore the theory and practice of basic geometric floral design, the identification of flowers and foliages, and the practical skills necessary for employment in the floral industry. Fresh, silk and dried flowers will be used.

5. Required Competencies (SLOs) for Articulation

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- A. Demonstrate the basic principles and elements of floral design by producing floral designs in class activities.
- B. Demonstrate knowledge of proper plant materials for floral designs, including knowing the plant names.
- C. Calculate the retail price of floral designs in order for a floral business to make a profit.

6. Assessment Methods

A grading system will be established by the instructor and implemented uniformly. Grades will be based on demonstrated proficiency in subject matter determined by multiple measurements for evaluation, one of which must be essay exams, skills demonstration or, where appropriate, the symbol system.

- A. Quizzes and exams that measure the student's ability to identify basic principles of floral designs and identify flowers and foliage by botanical and common name.
- B. Exercises that measure the student's ability to:
 - a. Prepare basic floral designs, using the tools common to the industry;
 - Explain design elements and characteristics as they pertain to a client's design requirements including appropriate retail price based on wholesale cost of materials;
 - c. Draft a care plan for cut flowers.
