Board Focus on Student Success

This month's Conversation about Student Success included a lively discussion between under-represented students and college faculty. Panelists Joan Ahrens, Grossmont College English Instructor, Chris Hill, Grossmont College Geology/ Oceanography Instructor, and Michael Wangler, Cuyamaca College Geography Instructor, provided insights regarding the large number of students that leave community colleges after only one semester, as well as large achievement gaps that exist for some of our most popular general education courses. Students Katrina Piliaris, Sundus Ali, Fadi Matti, Tatiana Odish, and Luay Aziz identified issues related to financial aid, the cost of textbooks and student software, as well as limited campus-based services as some of the barriers to their success. Students and faculty agreed that a clear connection between academic and career goals is the best motivation for student success.

Board Actions

Revenue Resolution Approved by Board

Trustees approved a resolution 3-1 (Rick Alexander opposed, Deanna Weeks absent, with student trustees Christopher Enders and Chuck Taylor casting advisory votes in favor) in support of establishing an oil severance tax as a revenue source for higher education that should be considered by the Governor and California State Legislature during budget deliberations.

Trustee **Alexander** offered an amendment that would not restrict the tax revenues, saying he was concerned about spending "silos" in Sacramento. The amendment was defeated.

The resolution received unanimous approval from the Districtwide Legislative Strategy Committee as a way to ease the state's fiscal challenge and support higher education funding, aiding the state's economic recovery. The resolution will be distributed to the Governor, San Diego's legislative delegation, and legislative leaders.

CSEA Agreement Ratified by Board

The Governing Board ratified the 2010-2011 Tentative Agreement between the California State Employees Association Chapter 707 and the District by a 4-0 vote (Weeks absent). Trustee Mary Kay Rosinski noted that many hours went into this agreement and thanked everyone who put in the work at the bargaining table on both teams. CSEA President Jan Recktenwald thanked the trustees for their vote, and the District and CSEA bargaining teams for their efforts.

Ratified by both CSEA membership and the Governing Board, the contract term is January 1, 2010, through December 31, 2011, with all negotiated changes effective on August 1, 2010.

From Closed Session

The Governing Board, by a 4-0 vote (**Weeks** absent) ratified the separation agreement for Dr. **Stuart Savin.**

Chancellor's Report



Chancellor **Cindy Miles** thanked **Arleen Satele** for the job she is doing as Administrator in Charge at Cuyamaca College following the departure of Dr. **Stuart Savin. Miles** noted that the entire college family has stepped up. "I'm really proud of this college," she said. **Miles** reported that a screening committee, led by Dr. **Sunny Cooke**, hopes to have an interim president in place for the coming academic year, before the start of classes. A search will then get underway for a permanent president.

Chancellor **Miles** thanked everyone who attended the discussion on student success prior to the Governing Board meeting; and expressed appreciation to **Jerry Buckley** and the Institutional Research staff, **Chris Hill**, and **Michael Wangler** for their continued input and participation in the presentations.

There is still no state budget in sight. Chancellor **Miles** said the District is watching the situation closely. Chancellor **Miles** congratulated Classified Senate President **Debi Miller** on being honored with the "Spirit of Leadership Award" at the recent statewide Classified Senate Leadership Conference. The District has received good media coverage over the past month including more than 20 print and electronic media stories. Among then was coverage of Congressman Duncan D. Hunter's job fair, summer course cuts, Vice President of Administrative Services **Tim Flood's** appointment, and Chancellor/Classified Senate award recipients.

Chandler Receives Chancellor/Classified Senate Award

President **Debi Miller** and Chemistry Instructor **Laurie LeBlanc** joined Chancellor **Cindy Miles** to present **Chandler** her award. **LeBlanc**, who nominated **Chandler**, said "She does a great job keeping us organized and on track." **Chandler** won praise for organizing a work-study program for student volunteers who offer support in exchange for career experience. **Miller** said her nomination scored high for initiative and innovation. **Chandler's** husband, sister, father, niece, and nephew were on hand to see her receive the award.

A celebration conga line of two dozen faculty, staff, and administrators led by Chancellor **Miles** snaked through the Cuyamaca campus, making its way to the lab to announce **Chandler's** award.

CSEA President Jan Recktenwald congratulated Melissa Chandler on her award and Michael Copenhaver on his re-election as Administrators' Association president.
