Chancellor Cindy Miles recognized and commended the swift actions of Grossmont College student Javier Partida, public safety dispatcher Tiffany Hungerford, and San Diego Sheriff's Deputy Felix Santiestiban for their actions that resulted in the arrest of a man who accosted a Grossmont College student.

On Oct. 22, Partida witnessed a female student being attacked in the parking garage, and honked his car horn to scare the man away. Partida then encouraged the student to report the attack. Hungerford took the report and issued a description of the suspect immediately. Deputy Santiestiban found the suspect hiding at the opposite side of the parking garage with a knife in his pocket. The arrest occurred just 17 minutes after the reporting of the attack.

Miles presented the three with Certificates of Appreciation for their actions. Cuyamaca College Student Trustee Elsa Hernandez thanked Partida for his actions on behalf of all female students.

Auxiliary and Foundation Reports

GCCCD Auxiliary Director **Diane Munson** presented the annual report on the Auxiliary's 2012/2013 activities. The Auxiliary processed \$6.5 million in funds, for a total of \$60 million over its 11-year history. The recent annual audit was successful with no findings.

John Valencia, Associate Vice Chancellor, Advancement and Communications and CEO of the Foundation for Grossmont & Cuyamaca Colleges, reported 2012/13 highlights: dispersing \$30,000 in emergency funding for students, \$40,000 to veterans, \$20,000 in mini-grants and \$9,000 to support cultural events. Current initiatives include the launch of a campaign focusing on donors, alumni, and retirees, and expanding the "Possibilities Roundtable" for those giving at least \$1,200 a year.

Board Reports

Garrett and Trustee **Edwin Hiel** attended the Governance Institute for Student Success with the chancellor and reported on its significance. Both noted they look forward to identifying Board priorities during the 2014 Board retreat. **Garrett** also attended the Griffins football game and the Grossmont College Theatre Arts Department production, *To Gillian on her 37th Birthday*

Board member **Debbie Justeson** said she would like to learn more about the programs that are implemented from the District's strategic planning process.

Board member **Mary Kay Rosinski** and her husband attended a recent Grossmont College Griffin football game against Saddleback College and thoroughly enjoyed a top-notch Culinary Arts dinner.

Board member **Greg Barr** said the report he requested on the impact of the federal government shutdown on District programs and services showed no direct effect.

Hernandez reported on events at Cuyamaca College, including fundraising for breast cancer research and participation in the Student Senate General Assembly workshops and sessions. She announced the upcoming College Hour on November 26 would focus on Native Americans.

Grossmont College Student Trustee **Zack Gianino** provided a report on Veterans Week activities, his attendance at the "Breaking Boundaries" student dance performance, and meeting State Assemblywoman **Shirley Weber** during an on-campus presentation.

- The mens' water polo team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Conference championship. Longtime Grossmont swim, dive, and water polo Coach Brian Harvey recently celebrated 600-plus wins as a coach.
- The accreditation visit for the Cardiovascular Technology Program received lots of praise and no reports of deficiencies. The evaluation team's recommendations go to the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs.




- President Mark Zacovic met with community members and BMX riders concerning the no trespassing signs that were erected on the Nature Preserve.

Rearic reported on the installation of a new Verizon cellphone tower at Grossmont College, and displayed coverage maps before and after installation showing improvement.

Associate Vice Chancellor **Tim Corcoran** reported on successful labor negotiations with AFT Local 1931, CSEA Chapter 707, Confidential Employees, Confidential Administrators regarding the Resource Allocation formula; a tentative agreement with AFT on an adjunct faculty healthcare proposal; and a tentative agreement with CSEA on a three-year contract beginning Jan. 1, 2014.

Chancellor **Cindy Miles** congratulated **Gianino** on his speech and debate team achievements and thanked everyone for the incredible work done in preparation for the recent accreditation site visits.

Muñoz reported ESL Instructor Guillermo Coles attended and delivered a report on the ESL Summit on Acceleration last week, attended by 70 people from nine California community college districts.

Grossmont College Academic Senate president **Sue Gonda** reviewed resolutions passed at the recent meeting of the statewide Academic Senate, noting diversity was a common theme of several resolutions.
