Pre-board Discussion about District Planning and Student Success

A report on planning for student success was given by **Chris Tarman**, senior dean for research, planning and institutional effectiveness; **Chris Hill**, senior dean, college planning and institutional effectiveness at Grossmont College; and **Scott Thayer**, vice president of student services at Cuyamaca College.

The three explained how each site's planning is woven into a comprehensive integrated process guiding the District's overall vision, mission and values. They updated the Governing Board on the work of the District Strategic Planning and Budget Council, which is charged with reviewing planning and budget priorities.

Emeritus Status Granted By Governing Board to Janice Johnson

Governing Board members voted 5-0 to confer emeritus status on **Janice Johnson** in recognition of her many years of service as a Grossmont College faculty member.

Johnson first came to the District as a Grossmont College student in 1977. She then became an employee, eventually working as a counselor, articulation officer, and Dean of EOPS at Grossmont College.

Grossmont College Faculty Senate President **Sue Gonda** said many students attributed their success in working through personal hardships to **Johnson's** one-on-one efforts. **Gonda** said Johnson took on the time-consuming task of making sure the college's courses were articulated with the universities to enable transfer degrees.

Johnson told the Board that she has been thrilled to work at Grossmont College since the day she was hired. "Every day is exciting, every day is different, and every day is a challenge," she said.

Chancellor **Cindy Miles** read from several letters of support for **Johnson's** nomination, calling her an inspiring role model. The letters noted that **Johnson** developed the college's first online Personal Development courses and that she originated the Summer Bridge program for new students.
