



COUNTY SUPERVISORS APPROVE TWO DISTRICT-RELATED RESOLUTIONS



On May 8, the San Diego County Board of Supervisors approved two resolutions on behalf of Proposition V, the District's \$398 million construction bond approved by East County voters in 2012. Their action is one of the critical steps on the path to issuing \$126 million in 2018 Series B bonds and refinancing current debt on Proposition R and Proposition V Series A bonds.

Refinancing – technically referred to as refunding in the bond world – provides savings to taxpayers over the life of the debt. Vice Chancellor of Business Services Sue Rearic attended the meeting as the District representative, where the action passed on consent. The resolutions directs the District to sell bonds, established the County of San Diego as paying agent and investment manager, and directs the county Auditor and Controller to maintain taxes on the tax roll.

PUBLIC SAFETY HOLDS STOP THE BLEED TRAINING



More than 50 people at both campuses participated in Stop the Bleed training offered through the Public Safety Department. The training is intended to cultivate efforts to encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency.

The course, taught by experts from Scripps Memorial Hospital La Jolla, offered hemorrhage control training that will save lives.
