



ACCREDITATION WORKSHOPS



Sean Hancock, Vice Chancellor for Student and Institutional Success, led two workshops on accreditation and the role that District Services plays in the process. The two college accreditation liaison officers, **Brianna Hays**, Senior Dean, Institutional Effectiveness, Success, and Equity at Cuyamaca College and **Catherine Webb**, Senior Dean for College Planning and Institutional

Effectiveness at Grossmont College, also participated.

Hancock explained that accreditation is a peer review process that assures the education community and the general public that institutions meet standards of quality. Colleges are also required to be accredited in order to receive government funding.

Hancock has been leading the District Services efforts to work with the colleges in completing their Institutional Self Evaluation Reports (ISER). The reports have been submitted to the accrediting teams, which will be visiting the campuses September 30-October 3. A determination from the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges is expected in January.

SELF-SERVICE LAUNCHES

Beginning with the summer semester, the Information Technology Department (IT), with guidance from the colleges and faculty, implemented an innovative new feature within Self-Service called Add Authorizations. Add Authorizations is replacing the previous “add code” feature within WebAdvisor as a method to add students to courses. This will set the stage for more advance student centered features to be added to Self-Service such as Student Planning (Spring 2020)

Self-Service is more secure for students and is more web-friendly and easier for students and faculty to use. IT will work closely with college staff and faculty to migrate all of the relevant features we use from WebAdvisor into Self-Service by 2021. Thanks to the IT Department, college staff and faculty for leading this effort.
