The meeting was called to order at 6:38 p.m. by Board President Gary Kendrick.

Irene Lisowski receives Chancellor/ Classified Senate Award for June 2001

Presidents' and Vice Chancellors' reports

President Martinez expressed pride in the academic and athletic achievements of the Grossmont College Athletic Department, and invited Bobby Thompson, Associate Dean, Athletics, to introduce coaches and athletes to the Board and share some of the achievements of the past year. Thompson introduced Coaches Eric Sato, Women's Volleyball; Fred Featherstone, Men's Volleyball; Ed Olsen, Baseball; Rick Trestrail, Women's Softball; Howard Hawver, Women's Soccer; Dave Jordan, Football; Doug Weber, Men's Basketball; Laura Williges, Women's Basketball; Jennifer Higginson, Women's Swimming, Diving, and Water Polo; Megan Lowrey, Women's Tennis; and Scott Strange, Men's Tennis. The coaches introduced the student athletes in attendance and shared their accomplishments of the past year.

Thompson recognized Bob Rump, former Grossmont College Athletic Director and Football Coach, for his achievements, which include induction into the California Community Colleges Commission on Athletics Hall of Fame and the California Coaches Hall of Fame. Rump's teams won 19 conference championships, 5 state championships, and he was coach of the year 15 times.

Trustee Clark arrived at 7:50 p.m.

President Martinez, with the assistance of Vice President White, presented plaques to Gates Millennium Scholars Sarah Barrett, Rosemary Bailey, and Jimmy Chuang, who were recognized for their outstanding academic achievements.

Martinez presented an emeritus plaque to retired Grossmont faculty member William Bornhorst and commented on highlights of Bornhorst's 30-year career as a Chemistry Instructor.

Interim President Agosto shared items of interest from Cuyamaca College and announced that he will invite Cuyamaca Coach Patrick Thiss, recipient of seven athletic achievement awards, to attend the July 17 Board meeting.

Vice Chancellor McMahan announced that students may now register online using credit cards.

Suarez called the Board's attention to events scheduled in July and August. He announced that Cathy Unger, Member, California Community Colleges Board of Governors, plans to visit the District July 19 for campus tours and a roundtable discussion with faculty and staff representatives. He extended an invitation to Board members to participate.

She added that it is necessary to rent pool facilities off campus, as the Grossmont pool is substandard. She attended a Statewide Academic Senate Leadership Institute in San Diego recently, where she met with colleagues from throughout the state.

Harvey requested that the Board consider receiving brief reports at each Board meeting by Grossmont faculty members highlighting departmental activities. Board President Kendrick agreed to discuss this with the Board at an upcoming Board retreat.
