**GOVERNING BOARD
MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
Tuesday, February 18, 2003**

The regular meeting of the Governing Board of the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District was held on Tuesday, February 18, 2003, at 6:30 p.m., in the Griffin Gate, Grossmont College, 8800 Grossmont College Drive, El Cajon, California.

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. by Board President Dr. Timothy Caruthers.

Adjourn to Closed Session

Caruthers adjourned the open session at 6:33 p.m., and the Board met in closed session in the Associated Students of Grossmont College (ASGC) Board Room from 6:36 p.m. until 7:25 p.m., in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act, pursuant to Government Code Section 54957 to consider release of public employee(s); and Section 54957.6 to confer with the District Chief Negotiator regarding United Faculty, California School Employees Association (CSEA), Administrators' Association, and Supervisory/Confidential matters.

Reconvene in Open Session/Announcement of Closed Session Action(s)

Board President Caruthers reconvened the open session at 7:37 p.m. He reported there were no closed session actions to announce.

Approval of Minutes

On the motion of Members Clark/Kraft, with a vote of 4-0 (Trustee Alexander was not present for the vote), the Board approved as presented the minutes of the January 21, 2003, regular meeting.

Changes to Docket of Business

Chancellor Suarez announced the following changes to the Docket of Business:

- **Item 136—Public Comment:** There is a correction on Item 136 on the green Docket of Business. The present collective bargaining agreement is effective January 1, 2003, through December 31, 2005. The same correction applies to attachment A of the Docket of Business.
- **Item 201—Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee:** A revised Attachment A was distributed. Two names were inadvertently omitted from the original version.
- **Item 304—Ratification of Signatures on Agreements:** Attachment A3, under II. Income Agreements, the San Diego State University Foundation agreement is removed pending further college-level review.

Cutting

and Director of Institutional Research Phillips made a presentation on data sharing. He attended the Grossmont College Office Professional Training (OPT) graduation, which was also attended by Assemblywoman Dede Alpert, who has been a long time supporter of community colleges. In addition, he, Chancellor Suarez, and President Martinez met recently with Assistant Secretary of Education Carol D'Amico regarding the Grossmont College One-Stop Center and the Workforce Investment Act.

Cutting went on to report that he attended the annual trustee dinner meeting of the San Diego and Imperial Counties Community Colleges Association (SDICCCA), where Tidal Wave II was the focus of discussion. A statewide ballot initiative was proposed for dealing with community college issues such as equalization, and urging that tuition fees remain with districts rather than go into the state general fund.

Cutting reported that he, Trustee Alexander, Chancellor Suarez, Vice Chancellor Austin, and Director of Intergovernmental Relations Quittner attended the Community College League of California Legislative Seminar in Sacramento, where a caucus of low-funded districts led by GCCCD took place, with 18 California community college districts represented.

Cutting reported he moderated a workshop at the recent Association of Community College Trustees/American Association of Community Colleges legislative conference in Washington, D.C., and noted that community colleges received a double whammy with the President's proposed budget in terms of VTEA, Welfare Reform, and adult education, which will result in a devastating effect on community colleges.

Cutting met with Senator Dede Alpert and Assembly Members Jay LaSuer and Shirley Horton, who are responsive to community college issues, and he and Quittner met with legislators in Washington. He added that there is good news from Congressman Duncan Hunter's office, which cannot yet be divulged, but may result in money for programs at each of the colleges.

Trustee Clark thanked the Grossmont College Mathematics, Natural Sciences, and Exercise Science/Wellness program for the presentation and tour of the Grossmont College science labs prior to this evening's Board meeting. She attended the SDICCCA annual trustee dinner meeting, which was also attended by SDSU and UCSD representatives, who expressed interest in action to support fair budgets for community colleges.

Trustee Kraft thanked President Martinez and Vice President Colli for arranging the presentation and tour of the Grossmont College science labs this evening, and commented on the excitement expressed by faculty and staff about the new science facilities coming on line in the next few years.

Chancellor Suarez acknowledged with sadness the recent loss of two fine Grossmont College faculty members due to heart attacks: Corky Harrison (December 22, 2002) and Don Fitzgerald (February 10, 2003), and called for a moment of silence.

Suarez called on Vice Chancellor McMahan, who invited Director of Information Systems Henry Eimstad to present the quarterly status report on District technology. Eimstad reviewed the 2002-2003 Information Technology Plan and challenges for the future.

Suarez thanked Trustees Alexander and Cutting for participating in the CCLC Legislative Seminar, where concern was expressed about funding for our District and districts throughout California.

Jane West.

She added that the State Legislative Analysts Office report, which will clarify the amount of the state budget deficit, is due February 19.

United Faculty President Amov expressed sadness on the recent death of two colleagues. He congratulated the three faculty members recognized at tonight's meeting, which he equated to lifetime achievement awards.

Grossmont Academic Senate President Harvey echoed sentiments about the loss of two colleagues. She expressed appreciation to Bill Bradley, Dean of Math, Natural Sciences and Exercise Science/Wellness, for the pre-Board meeting presentation and tour of the Grossmont College science labs. With regard to the public presentation by Mike Ross, she reported that Grossmont instructors are on a tight timeline regarding submission of textbook requests. Harvey reported she has shared with the Grossmont Academic Senate resolutions passed by the Board opposing budget cuts and supporting equity. She expressed appreciation to Vice Chancellor McMahan, who visited the Senate to discuss the budget situation. She added that she and Cuyamaca Academic Senate President Setzer are committed to working together in facing impending budget cuts.

Harvey

Cuyamaca Academic Senate President Setzer reported he missed the January Board meeting due to personal reasons. He commended the Board on the resolutions passed at that meeting regarding equalization and expressing opposition to the Governor's proposed budget cuts. He indicated that both Academic Senates plan to adopt similar resolutions. He reported that events are planned for March 17 in Sacramento and locally, in which community college constituencies will attempt to influence legislators in Sacramento. He echoed Harvey's sentiments that the faculty at both sites are committed to working together in getting through these difficult times.

Setzer

Administrators' Association representative Taccone expressed appreciation at how well communication has been across the District with regard to the budget situation, and reported he will do his best to keep the faculty and staff in his division informed. He encouraged people to write letters to legislators. He added his condolences to the families and friends of the Grossmont faculty members who passed away, and commented that Don Fitzgerald hired him to teach at Grossmont College.

Classified Senate representative Murray congratulated those recognized at tonight's Board meeting. She expressed the hope that District faculty and staff will continue to pull together through difficult times.

CSEA representative McDade echoed Murray's comments, noting that such things help build character. He added there are many things he would like to do to increase services to students. He remarked that CSEA has not yet begun negotiations, but expressed the belief that all agree on the basic tenets on how we can grow in these times of financial restraints.
