

## **AP 5220      Shower Facilities for Homeless Students**

The District maintains athletic shower facilities for student use on campus that may be used by any homeless student who is enrolled in a minimum of 1 unit of coursework at either campus, has paid enrollment fees, and is in good standing with the District.

A homeless student is defined as a student who is under the age of 25 who does not have a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. This includes, but is not limited to, students who: are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters; have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings; or are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.

All other students enrolled in coursework at either campus in the District, who have paid enrollment fees and are in good standing with the District may also utilize the on-campus athletic shower facilities at either campus.

Athletic shower facilities are located in Building 41 at Grossmont College and Building D at Cuyamaca College and are generally open for use by students during normal operating hours of the athletic facilities. Usage by the general student population, regardless of homeless status, must not conflict with campus intercollegiate athletic activities. As a result, each campus will publish a shower facility usage procedure in its respective catalogs and on the appropriate college webpage that will inform students, staff, faculty and volunteers of this requirement and where they can find the most current information on scheduled intercollegiate activities so a conflict does not occur.
