GCCCD Cohorts of Incoming New High School Graduates¹ 2006, 2008 and 2010

Highlights:

- New high school graduate cohorts have a higher percentage of full-time students compared to all other students, and more similar proportions of male and female students.
- The percentage of students enrolled at both colleges in a given semester has increased.
- The percentage of new high school graduates assessed by their first Fall semester has increased for both Math and English assessment.
- The percentage of cohort students assessed into Basic Skills English has increased, while the percentage assessed into Basic Skills Math has decreased.
- More than half of all Fall semester credit enrollments for new high school graduates are in the following five subjects: English, Math, Exercise Science, History, PDC.
- Fall semester course success rates have increased, while Fall semester course withdrawal rates have decreased.
- Fall-to-Spring persistence rates for new high school graduates have increased.
- New high school graduates are attempting fewer units, but completing more of those units.
